The School Day



There are **9 periods** in a school day. School starts at 8.55am and finishes at 3.00pm.

School begins at **8.55am** every morning and all students are expected to be in school by this time. The day continues as follows:

St. Mary's operates a Biometric System for the school canteen. A letter will be sent with the school information in August to fully explain how the system operates.

*KS4 Lunchtime - 12.50pm - 1.30pm

As part of our Year 8 induction, Year 11 Guides will escort your Form Class to and from each class. These Guides will assist you for the first week until you settle in and find your way around your new school. Year 8 students are also allowed to go five minutes early for lunch for the first two weeks. This will give you a chance to become familiar with the canteen / lunch hall and our biometric system.

If Absent from School

When you return to school, bring a note from home explaining why you were absent. Give this note to your Form Teacher. Notes are also available in the back of the Homework Diary – Explanations for Absences.

It is essential that we have an up to date **mobile/home telephone number** where parents/carers may be contacted during the day or in the case of emergencies.

Cross - Curricular Skills

Each subjects develops important cross curricular skills, these skills help students to become an independent, lifelong learner, they include:

- Communication Development of language skills in all areas of the curriculum and in everyday situations
- Using Mathematics Ability to apply knowledge and understanding of Mathematics throughout the curriculum and in everyday life
- Using ICT-Ability to handle and communicate information, solve problems and ask questions through the effective use of ICT in different contexts

Thinking Skills and Personal Capabilities

These skills are developed across all subject areas and are essential for everyday life, education and work, they include:

- Managing Information e.g., recording and presenting information
- Thinking, Problem Solving and Decision Making e.g., making connections, generating possible solutions
- Being Creative e.g., experimenting with ideas
- Self-Management e.g., being aware of personal strengths and interests
- Working with Others e.g., group and peer work

Guide to Homework





At the start of the school year each student is given their own diary and will be encouraged to be independent learners and use their diary effectively to record all homework, attendance, school notices and keep a record of their Standardised Assessment Results.

Parents/Carers should check their daughter's diary regularly and sign it at the end of each week. Form Teachers will also check each student's diary weekly. Students are expected to record their Personalised Target Percentage for each subject in their diary together with the results of each Standardised Assessments.

Students are expected to record all homework in their diaries and complete homework to a high standard. There are a range of types of homework that may be given including: written; reading; learning; research and practical tasks. Homework is an essential element of learning, it consolidates work that has been undertaken in school and extends knowledge and understanding. Homework encourages Students to learn independently, developing important self-management skills.

Homework for Year 8 will not be excessive and therefore on occasions when there is not much homework, students should spend time looking over work done that day, spend time reading a book or reading over class notes.

We encourage our students to do their homework on the day it is given and at a regular time each day, maybe after a short break when getting home from school, so that the rest of the evenings are free. Students should do their homework away from distractions, devices and screens and in a quiet place. Parents should encourage their daughter to organise their school bags themselves each evening, ready for the next day's classes. While parents can offer help and advice with homework and organisation of books, parents should not do these tasks for them.

Positive Behaviour

St Mary's operates a positive behaviour system where students receive 'Achievement Points' for working hard and making a positive contribution to the life of the school. Rewards are given to students including: Student of the Month Award, Praise Postcards, vouchers, treats and Certificates. Behaviour points are given if a student does not follow the school rules. An after-school detention will be issued when 8 behaviour points have been awarded.

Assessments



Students undertake a number of assessments throughout the year where progress and attainment are closely monitored.

These assessments include:

- Class tests
- Projects and practical work
- Group activities
- Research tasks and reports
- Debates and presentations
- Standardised Assessments

Standardised Assessments

In each subject students will have an individual Personalised Target Percentage. This is based on their attainment in baseline assessment completed at the start of Year 8. Students will complete 4 Standardised Assessments in each subject throughout the year, (under exam conditions) and their performance in each is closely benchmarked against their Personalised Target.

The school will send reports home twice a year in December (short report) and June (long report) so that parents can see their daughter's progress.
